SUBJECT: REAL-TIME BIDIRECTIONAL COMMUNICATION

INTRODUCED BY: PALTMED MICHIGAN, CMDA-THE COLORADO SOCIETY FOR POST-ACUTE AND LONG-TERM CARE MEDICINE

INTRODUCED ON: MARCH 2025

WHEREAS, Post-Acute and Long-Term Care Medical Association (PALTmed) has, since
2014, actively sought to identify and foster the development of robust, bidirectional electronic
messaging and document exchanges among nursing homes and other community health care
providers in post-acute and long-term care (PALTC) settings; and

WHEREAS, gaps in interoperability persist, resulting in daily communication errors that cause preventable patient harm, diminish care quality, and increase healthcare costs; and

WHEREAS, seamlessly integrated, real-time, two-way communication among all stakeholders—including hospital systems, sub-acute and long-term care facilities, assisted living communities, physicians, pharmacies, and other providers of senior care—represents a critical factor in ensuring patient safety and continuity of care; therefore be it resolved

RESOLVED, that our Post-Acute and Long-Term Care Medical Association (PALTmed), advocate for regulatory legislation that mandates **real-time bidirectional communication** between electronic medical record (EMR) systems across the full medical care continuum and the **funding** and **enforcement** of this legislation. PALTmed will work on this legislation with its partner organizations and all relevant stakeholders, including hospital systems and EMR vendors; and be it further

RESOLVED, that our Post-Acute and Long-Term Care Medical Association (PALTmed) notify PALTmed members, of the EMR platforms, technologies, and programs making progress toward achieving universal interoperability in PALTC settings with regular frequency, to be determined by the transitions of care committee; and be it further

RESOLVED, that our Post-Acute and Long-Term Care Medical Association (PALTmed) supports its members who wish to implement interoperable systems of bidirectional real-time communications by **facilitating partnerships** among all provider groups that are integral in care transitions, including hospital systems, accountable care organizations, EMR vendors, pharmacies, outpatient and specialty providers.; and be it further
